COURSE DETAILS:

Accommodation:

Registration fee USD \$20

USD \$20 per person per night for a twin-room (\$35+5%tax).

For whom:

- Denominational leaders
- Existing or future mission executives and promoters
- Bible school teachers involved in courses concerning world missions
- Pastors willing to grow in understanding the world missions

Goals:

After the course the student will

- be able to provide vision and structure for the local church's cross-cultural mission involvement
- possess tools for the development of the national church's cross-cultural mission structure

COURSE OVERVIEW:

Program:

- have preparedness for creating holistic mission strategies for different missional needs
- be able to communicate the basic guidelines in the mission theology
- have understanding of the intercultural issues related to the missionary work
- be empowered to carry leadership positions in the cross-cultural ministry
- be able to perceive and communicate the actual global status in the world missions
- manage the characteristics of the Pentecostal missiology.

Format:

1 week course, 5x4h lectures+ 5x2h team work
Writing project linked to the context of the student after one-week lectures.

Certificate:

The course is Master's level training, and a certificate can be provided after implementing the requirements including the writing project. The course can also be attended without academic requirements.

TEACHERS

The responsible teacher Dr. Arto Hämäläinen, Holder of the Chair of the Mission studies in the Continental Theological Seminary in Brussels, Belgium, and Faculty Member of the Global University/USA. His teaching ministry has taken place in about 60 countries.

Dr. Hämäläinen is usually assisted by some other qualified trainers.
